



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What did God want them to do?

5:6 —/ Seek (NIV)/ Come back to (NLT) the LORD and live

5:15 —hate evil, love good, justice in the courts

5:24 —/ let justice roll on like a river (NIV)/ an endless river of righteous living (NLT)



WORKSHEET: "Injustice in Amos, Part 2: Rewrite injustices."



NOTE TO TEACHER: Each student chooses a line from the injustices to rewrite so it states the opposite; so it describes justice. For example, the injustice:/ "You buy the poor" (NIV)/ "You enslave poor people" (NLT) becomes justice: "Use your money to free people from poverty."



OPTIONAL: Students share their re-written justice statements with the class.

### Amos' Visions

Amos had visions of God's punishments. What were they?

7:1 —locusts

So Amos prayed for / Jacob (NIV)/ Israel (NLT). How did God respond?

7:3 —God relented.

What was the next punishment?

7:4 —fire

So Amos prayed again. How did God respond this time?

7:6 —God relented.

Then God showed Amos 2 more visions. What were they?


7:7 —plumb line

A plumb line always hangs straight down. The plumb line would show how far the people had strayed.

8:2 —basket of ripe fruit

This demonstrated that Israel was ripe for punishment.

PLUMB LINE



God said he would spare Israel no longer.

How will God punish them?

4:2 —take them away with hooks

9:1 —Bring down / pillars (NIV)/ roof of Temple (NLT), kill with sword

### But there is Hope


The book ends with God's promises. What are they?

9:8, end —He will not totally destroy / Jacob (NIV)/ Israel (NLT)

9:14 —God will bring Israel back from exile.

9:15 —God will plant Israel in their own land, never again be uprooted.

# Cartoon: The Story behind Obadiah





What is Habakkuk's complaint?

1:3 —/ Why does God tolerate wrongdoing? (NIV)/ Must I forever see these evil deeds? (NLT) Habakkuk was bothered by Judah's sin.

### God's Answer

God says, "Look and be amazed."

What is God going to do?

1:6 —raise up Babylonians

What are the Babylonians like?

(1:6) —/ ruthless and impetuous (NIV)/ cruel and violent (NLT)

### Habakkuk's Response

Does Habakkuk like this idea?

Finish this sentence from the end of verse 13:/ Why are you (NIV)/ Should you be (NLT) silent while the wicked...

1:13 —swallow up / those more righteous than themselves? (NIV)/ people more righteous than they?

In other words, the Babylonians are even worse than Judah!

They find the New Testament in the Old and the Old in the New. They corral Old Testament zoo animals, design an O.T. restaurant or play O.T. Snakes and Ladders. They discover how each Gospel tells Jesus' earthly story differently. They learn who Jesus is, what he said and did, and why he came.
